Many, but not all, of you will be aware of the sad news of the death on 2 January 2024 of our Founding Partner Richard Izard CNZM OBE. Trustee Sir Lockwood Smith, fundraiser Jenni Giblin, and I spent many hours in Richard's company and we will have treasured memories of those times. Richard provided incredible support for the Museum; without his generosity we would not have been able to start, let alone complete, Te Arawhata. Richard was old school New Zealand - loyal, patriotic, considered, and an honourable man who sealed commitments to us with a handshake. I represented the Trust, alongside Sir Lockwood, at Richard's moving funeral service in Taupo on 12 January. We extend our condolences to Richard's family.

A devastating blow came on 7 January with news of the death, in Paris, of our much loved and respected friend and colleague Rosaria Campbell, aged just 33. She was our Project Manager at Te Arawhata and then sadly, was diagnosed with cancer last year. Rosaria was a shining star - calm, competent and able to cope with the many unexpected issues that arise with a project like ours. Her loss is felt keenly by many in New Zealand and in France where she became part of the Le Quesnoy community. We miss Rosaria very much and send our sympathy to her parents, Vicki and Adrian, and her brothers Thornton and Oakley.

Despite the sad start to the year I am hoping that 2024 will bring many good things to Te Arawhata. We are going to build on the solid start made possible by many including Richard and Rosaria. I will report to you in March on the exciting changes proposed to our Trust Board and management structure - some new faces and fresh talent to inject even more energy into our work.

COMING UP IN 2024 -THE ALL BLACKS GIFT A BENCH TO TE ARAWHATA







ME EKE MAI - OUR BENCH IS YOUR BENCH

On 10 February we are unveiling of a specially carved All Blacks bench which has been donated to Te Arawhata by New Zealand Rugby.

In 2023 New Zealand Rugby donated three intricately carved benches to France to mark the sporting bond between France and New Zealand during the Rugby World Cup. A fourth bench has now been generously gifted to the NZ Liberation Museum – Te Arawhata. The installation of the bench is yet another symbol of the enduring ties between France and New Zealand. The bench is about community, a taonga (treasured object) with Māori motifs, created at the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute (NZMACI) – Ngā Kete Tuku Iho, in Rotorua and it is to be installed in the grounds and unveiled in a special ceremony on 10 February.

At 2:30pm, on 10 February, **Ngāti Rānana, the London Māori club**, will bless the bench with karakia and waiata. **New Zealand Rugby** will formally gift the bench and **Marie-Sophie Lesne, the Mayor of Le Quesnoy**, will also speak on the bonds between New Zealand and the town of Le Quesnoy. The general public are invited to attend the event and be part of this special ceremony. The museum will be open throughout the day for visitors. Following the ceremony refreshments will be served.

At 3:15pm, the Six Nations match, between France and Scotland, will be broadcast at the Te Arawhata.

Our current exhibition "From the Field to the Front" honours and remembers All Blacks who went to war. The exhibition was opened by Dame Patsy Reddy, Chair of New Zealand Rugby, at the museum opening in October last year.
